





MEANING: COMING OR ARRIVAL



Christians celebrate the birth of Jesus in His First Advent and anticipate the return of , Christ the King in His Second Advent. The Season of Advent is a time to focus on both the past and the future as we journey through life with Christ.

<u>TIME FRAME</u>: The observation of Advent starts on **December 1st**, the fourth Sunday before Christmas, and marks the beginning of the liturgical year/church calendar.

HANGING OF THE GREEN: The Evergreen represents growth and immortality. Churches are decorated with evergreen boughs, holly and wreaths during the first week of Advent to symbolize a new and everlasting life through Jesus the Christ.

<u>ADVENT WREATH</u>: A circular evergreen wreath with candles is placed in the church sanctuary. The green wreath represents the **HOPE** that we have in God, the hope of renewal, and the hope for eternal life.

The Circle represents the unending **LOVE** and forever presence of God.

<u>ADVENT CANDLES</u>: The Advent Wreath consists of five candles. One rose (joy) and three purple (royalty - hope, peace and love) candles are placed around the wreath; one white (purity) candle is placed in the center.

On the first Sunday of Advent, one purple candle is lit. On the Second Sunday, that purple candle is re-lit and another purple candle is lit. On subsequent Sundays, the candles are re-lit with each additional candle. Traditionally, the **rose** (joy) candle is lit on the Third Sunday.



The center candle (purity), called the **Christ Candle**, is lit on Christmas Eve or Christmas.

The light of the candles reminds us that *Jesus is the Light of the World* and we are all called to be a light in a world of darkness.

ADVENT COLORS:

TRADITIONAL - Purple is the color of majestic royalty and is used to welcome the Advent of the King. It is also the color of penitence and fasting.

CONTEMPORARY - Blue

Royal Blue also represents royalty and is used as a substitute for the purple because purple is used during Lent and the Holy Week to reflect the suffering endured by Christ.

Bright Blue is sometimes used to symbolize water (beginning life) or the night sky in anticipation of the pending announcement of the coming of the King.

THE BIRTH OF JESUS

LUKE 2: 1 - 20

- 1. In those days Caesar Augustus issued a decree that a census should be taken of the entire Roman world.
- 2. (This was the first census that took place while Quirinius was governor of Syria.)
- 3. And everyone went to his own town to register.



- 4. So Joseph also went up from the town of Nazareth in Galilee to Judea, to Bethlehem the town of David, because he belonged to the house and line of David.
- 5. He went there to register with Mary, who was pledged to be married to him and was expecting a child.
- 6. While they were there, the time came for the baby to be born,
- 7. And she gave birth to her firstborn, a son. She wrapped Him in cloths and placed Him in a manger, because there was no room for them in the inn.
- 8. And there were shepherds living out in the fields nearby, keeping watch over their flocks at night.
- 9. An angel of the Lord appeared to them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were terrified.
- 10. But the angel said to them, "Do not be afraid. I bring you good news of great joy that will be for all the people.

11. Today in the town of David a Savior has been born to you; He is Christ the Lord.

- 12. This will be a sign to you: You will find a baby wrapped in cloths and lying in a manger."
- 13. Suddenly a great company of the heavenly host appeared with the angel, praising God and saying,
- 14. "Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace to men on whom His favor rests."
- 15. When the angels had left them and gone into heaven, the shepherds said to one another, "Let's go to Bethlehem and see this thing that has happened, which the Lord has told us about."
- 16. So they hurried off and found Mary and Joseph, and the baby, who was lying in the manger.
- 17. When they had seen Him, they spread the word concerning what had been told to them about this child,
- 18. And all who heard it were amazed at what the shepherds said to them.
- 19. But Mary treasured up all these things and pondered them in her heart.
- 20. The shepherds returned, glorifying and praising God for all the things they had heard and seen, which were just as they had been told.



Kwanzaa: A Celebration of Family and Friends

THE SYMBOLS OF KWANZAA

Kwanzaa has seven basic symbols and two supplemental ones. Each represents values and concepts reflective of African culture and contributive to community building and reinforcement. The basic symbols re listed in Swahili and then in English.

Mazao (The Crops) These are symbolic of African harvest celebrations and of the rewards of productive and collective labor.

Mkeka (The Mat) This is symbolic of our tradition and history and, therefore, the foundation on which we build.

Kinara (The Candle Holder) This is symbolic of our roots, our parent people -- continental Africans.

Muhindi (The Corn) This is symbolic of our children and our future which they embody.

Mishumaa Saba (The Seven Candles)

These are symbolic of the Nguzo Saba, the Seven Principles, the matrix and minimum set of values which African people are urged to live by in order to rescue and reconstruct their lives in their own image and according to their own needs.

Kikombe cha Umoja (The Unity Cup) This is symbolic of the foundational principle and practice of unity which makes all else possible.

Zawadi (The Gifts)

These are symbolic of the labor and love of parents and the commitments made and kept by their children.

A Supplemental symbol:

Bendera (The Flag)

The colors of the Kwanzaa flag are **black**, **red** and **green**; **black for the people**, **red for their struggle**, and **green for the future and hope that comes from their struggle**. It is based on the colors given by the Hon. Marcus Garvey as national colors for African people throughout the world.

Private Food Caterers:

Business Name.

Copy of W-9 - Request for Taxpayer Identification Number and Certification.

Copy of Business License.

- \$1,000,000 Indemnity Insurance protects against claims arising from possible negligence or Foodborne illness.
- Business and Church ministry or external organization must provide a copy of the contracted services.

All employees and volunteers must provide a copy of food handler permits.

Invoice form payment must include a detail of services provided.

Payments must be in the name of the business.

Ministry Food Handlers & Servers:

Ministry serving an event must be a recognized Church ministry

Copy of food handler permits for all employees and volunteers

Funds must be requested using an internal voucher

Cash Advance Voucher:

• Voucher must be signed by the ministry member receiving the cash advance and signed by the ministry chair or an authorized representative.

- Original receipts for funds spent must be submitted within 14 days after the event.
- If total receipts are less than funds advanced, the net difference must be remitted by check.

Reimbursement of out-of-pocket Purchases:

• Voucher must be signed by the ministry member requesting the reimbursement and signed by the ministry chair or an authorized representative.

• Original receipts for funds spent must be submitted within 14 days after the event.

Ministry chairs or authorized member of the ministry must approve the invoice prior to submitting to the Church Trustees for payment.





AARP: HOW TO RECOGNIZE TRAVEL SCAMS

The growing population of older Americans is vulnerable to vacation scams because many love to travel. Scammers will play on emotions.

Last year more than 30,000 people reported being *cheated on vacation travel*, with a median loss of \$800, according to the Federal Trade Commission (FTC), a consumer protection agency.

<u>"FREE" VACATIONS</u>- If you must pay some fees and taxes first, a legitimate company won't ask you to pay for a free prize.

ROBOCALLS ABOUT VACATION DEALS- Robocalls trying to sell you something are almost always illegal. Sites that claim to be able to help you get a passport, international travel visa, or other documents charge you high fees. Only trust the U.S. Department of State's website.

VACATION HOME AND RENTAL BOOKING SCAMS-These days, it's easy to connect directly with property owners who advertise their vacation homes online. But scammers are also trying to get your rental booking. For example, they hijack real rental listings and advertise them as their own, so when you show up for your vacation, you find out that other people are also booked for the same property. You have no place to stay, and your money is gone. Other scammers don't bother with real rentals — they make up listings for places that are not really for rent or don't exist.

3 WAYS TO AVOID TRAVEL SCAMS:

- 1. <u>Don't sign or pay until you know the terms of the deal.</u> Get a copy of the cancellation and refund policies before you pay.
- 2. <u>Do some research.</u> Look up travel companies, hotels, rentals, and agents with the words "scam," "review," or "complaint."
- 3. <u>Don't pay with wire transfers, gift cards, or cryptocurrency</u>. This is a sure sign of a scam. If there's a problem with what you paid for, you'll lose your money, and there's likely no way to track it or get it back.

If you think you may have been targeted by a travel scam, please report it to the Federal Trade Commission at **ReportFraud.ftc.gov** or your **State Attorney General's office.**




