

The Zionews Coordinating Committee was organized in 1956 by Deacon Tom Brown under the pastorate of Reverend Gil B. Lloyd.

Charter members included Edith Smith, Bessie Lyles, and Alva Smith. F. J. Johnson, Jr. was the editor of the first edition published in 1957.

That same year, the Committee expanded to include Yvonne Beatty, Zelda Brown, Clara Coleman, Nora Hatter, Helen Hornbuckle, Willie Horton, Katherine Houston, Linzy Macklin, Marguerite Robinett, S.C. Valley and Barbara Washington.

The mimeographed, hand-stapled Zionews was distributed every Sunday after church services.




HONORING OUR NEWEST NONAGENARIAN, SISTER ELMA HORTON

The Rev. Dr. Julie Vaughn will be leading Mount Zion Baptist Church's weekly Wednesday night virtual BIBLICAL ETHICS from 7 to 8 p.m. on January 8, 15, 22, 29, and February 5, 12, 19, and 26, 2025. The Topic: What Does the Lord Require?

The task involves illustrating the connections between Scriptures and challenging ethical issues. The use of the Bible for ethical decisions begins with the light of Scripture: "Your word is a lamp to my feet and a light for my path." Psalm 119:105.

The Discussion will include some examples connecting poverty and orphans with Isaiah 58:1-12, racism, and human rights—Genesis 9:18-27; James 2:1-13, 25-26. Gambling and Greed - Matthew 6:19-34. Media, entertainment, and pornography—Philippians 4:4-9; cohabitation and adultery 1 Thessalonians 4: 1-8; divorce with Malachi 2:10-16; possessions, economics and wealth with Deuteronomy 8:1-20; and care for the environment with Psalm 8:1-9.

The result of attending this biblical ethics series is a stimulating resource and guide for developing a solid foundation for the biblical sermons and will help the preachers and teachers speak to the ethical challenges facing the church. Each Bible session includes concluding points, a bibliography, and discussion questions for ethical decisions.

EPIPHANY (*i-PIF-a-nee*), is a Christian day that celebrates the revelation of God incarnate as Jesus Christ.

The meaning of the name Epiphany is Revelatory Manifestation of A Divine Being. In Western Christianity, the feast commemorates principally (but not solely) the visit of the Magi to the Christ Child, and thus Jesus Christ's physical manifestation to the Gentiles. The feast of the Epiphany, in some denominations, also initiates the liturgical season of Epiphanytide.

Epiphany, also called Theophany, is a celebration of God manifesting as the baby Jesus and revealing Himself to the world. The holiday marks the day the Magi, often referred to as the three kings or wise men, visited the baby Jesus in Bethlehem.

In the Bible, the Epiphany is Jesus' visit from the Magi, aristocratic men from the east who followed a star to see the newborn baby Jesus in Bethlehem. They brought Jesus gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh. Gold was considered a symbol of kings, frankincense a perfume representing divinity, and myrrh an anointing/bitter embalming oil that symbolized/foreshadowed death.

Jesus' baptism is also celebrated during Epiphany. The holiday is sometimes known as **Three Kings Day**. **The traditional date for the feast is January 6.** In the New Testament the word is used in 2 Timothy 1:10 to refer either to the birth of Christ or to His appearance after His resurrection, and five times to refer to His Second Coming. In many Western Christian Churches, the eve of the feast is celebrated as Twelfth Night (Epiphany Eve). The Monday after Epiphany is known as Plough Monday.



## A HOLIDAY BEFITTING A KING



It took nearly two decades to pass legislation for a national holiday in honor of the *Reverend Dr. Martin Luther King*, *Jr*. His was the first new holiday since 1948. Dr. King is the only American, besides President George Washington, to have a national holiday designated on his birthday. Citizens and organizations, especially the Southern Christian Leadership Conference, lobbied for fifteen years and collected more than six million signatures to make Dr. King's special day a reality. Local efforts in the Pacific Northwest were steadfast and met with considerable resistance. California was the first state to honor Dr. King's birthday.

#### **LOCAL AND NATIONAL TIMELINES**

<u>April 8, 1968</u>: *Rep. John Conyers*, D-MI. submitted the first legislation proposing Dr. King's birthday as a holiday, four days after Dr. King was assassinated. (Rep Conyers had hired *Rosa Parks* when she was fired from her job in Montgomery for refusing to give up her seat on the bus to a white man.)

<u>January 15, 1969</u>: About 1,200 automotive-plant workers in North Tarrytown, N.Y., stayed home from work in observance of Dr. King's birthday; 60 were suspended and others were threatened with disciplinary action.

<u>March 25, 1970</u>: *Rep. Conyers* and *Rep. Shirley Chisholm*, D-N.Y., announced hearings to study the holiday proposal after petitions carrying 6 million signatures were submitted to Congress.

April 10, 1970: California passed legislation making Dr. King's birthday a school holiday.

<u>July 15, 1970</u>: The Seattle School Board designated Dr. King's birthday a school holiday starting in 1971. *State Rep. George Fleming* convened hearings to make the date a legal holiday in Washington.

<u>January 1981</u>: In two incidents, six workers were fired from Seattle's Todd Shipyards after distributing leaflets to support Dr. King's holiday.

<u>August 2, 1983</u>: The House of Representatives approved legislation, #338-90, making Dr. King's birthday a national legal holiday on the third Monday in January beginning in 1986.

October 19, 1983: The Senate, defying efforts by Sen. Jesse Helms, R-N.C., to sidetrack legislation, approved the measure for Dr. King's birthday by a vote of 78-22.

November 2, 1983: Legislation for a national holiday was signed by President Ronald Reagan.

February 24, 1984: The Washington State Legislature approved a holiday for State schools.

**September 11, 1984**: The Seattle City Council made the third Monday in January a holiday for city employees in honor of Dr. King's birthday.

<u>January 20, 1986</u>: The first nationwide observance of Dr. King's birthday as a "legal" holiday was held on this date; however, millions of citizens did not wait until 1986 to celebrate Dr. King's

greatness. The King County Council changed its name to honor Dr. King, but it took another twenty years to garner State approval.

April 19, 2005: King County was *officially* renamed in honor of Dr. King when Gov. Christine Gregoire signed into law Senate Bill 5332. The county was originally named in 1852 for Vice President William Rufus de Vane King, an Alabama plantation owner and lifetime companion of James Buchanan. [God is awesome!]

This window in the Sanctuary honoring Dr. King was one of 18 designed and manufactured exclusively for Mount Zion by the late *Mr. Douglas Phillips* of Cleveland, OH. At the time, he was the owner of the only Black stained glass window company in the United States.




Dr. King's only visit to Seattle was in November of 1961 as the guest speaker for the Mount Zion Brotherhood Lecture Series. He also spoke at Garfield, High School, Temple de Hirsch and the University of Washington. The arrival of Dr. McKinney's former Morehouse classmate was the source of great controversy.

Two weeks before Dr. King's scheduled arrival, Mount Zion was forced to find

another venue when the negotiated agreement with FPC was retracted.







#### Article X - Annual Elections

#### Section 3: Procedure

At least two (2) weeks before the election, the Nominating Committee shall present to the Church the names of one or more persons for each office to be filled. This ballot is to be posted so that all members know those who are being placed in nomination. It shall be the privilege of any two (2) members, qualified to vote, to place in nomination the name of any eligible person for any office, not so nominated, and such nomination shall be placed on the ballot.

No nominations shall be made from the floor at the time of election, but each voter may vote for any one he/she pleases by writing in the name on the ballot. All annual elections shall be by written ballot, a majority of the ballots cast being necessary for the election of any


