


**The Zionews Coordinating Committee** was organized in 1956 by Deacon Tom Brown under the pastorate of Reverend Gil B. Lloyd.

Charter members included Edith Smith, Bessie Lyles, and Alva Smith. F. J. Johnson, Jr. was the editor of the first edition published in 1957.

That same year, the Committee expanded to include Yvonne Beatty, Zelda Brown, Clara Coleman, Nora Hatter, Helen Hornbuckle, Willie Horton, Katherine Houston, Linzy Macklin, Marguerite Robinett, S.C. Valley and Barbara Washington.

The mimeographed, hand-stapled Zionews was distributed every Sunday after church services.



**NPBC FAR WEST REGIONAL REPORT:** The 36<sup>th</sup> Annual Walter Cade, Jr National Baptist Laymen's Far West Regional Workshop was held April 11-13, 2025, at the Renaissance LAX Hotel, Los Angeles, CA.

The theme and Scripture for this conference was "Rooted and Grounded in Christ," Ephesians 3:17. The attendees were from the states of, Arizona, California, Nevada, Utah, and Washington.

Deacon Joel Hobbs and I attended the Conference along with 24 others from Washington. There was talk among the attendees that reminded them of when we used to travel in large groups to the Conventions.

The young people were in charge of the Friday evening Welcome program. The speakers as well as the dancers were great. The Bible Bowl Trivia has always been the highlight of Youth and Young Adult Night. There were young men participants from Washington and Utah. I was amazed at how knowledgeable the young men were about the Bible. At times the audience had trouble refraining from shouting out the answers.

Saturday morning after breakfast we assembled for Devotion. Afterwards, we went to the workshops. Deacon Clarence Williams from New Beginnings Christian Fellowship taught a class, "Rooted and Grounded in My Faith." I heard that he did an excellent job.

There were 3 classes for the men and one for the ladies. Dr. Yvette Jackson, Vice President of the Far West Region NBC USA, Inc. Women's Auxiliary, taught our class, "Rooted and Grounded as Women of God." She was excellent and there was not a boring moment in the class.

We reconvened for the General Session. This year was an Historic Session because for the first time there was a lady that spoke to the General Session. The history making speaker was Rev. Wilhelmina Daniel from Tabernacle Missionary Baptist Church where Rev. Dr. Robert L. Manaway, Sr. is the Pastor. He was in attendance to witness the occasion. Rev. Daniel delivered an inspiring message which was well received.

Saturday afternoon was the time for outings. The Women's luncheon was at Praises of Zion Baptist Church, Los Angeles. The Pastor has been ministering to them for over seventy years. The Laymen's luncheon was at Calvary Baptist Church, Los Angeles. They also had an Outreach Event after their lunch.

The Women's luncheon: Upon arrival at the Church, we were greeted by a room full of women. The room was beautifully decorated; we had reserved seating. We strolled in as they called us queens and said other flattering remarks. We truly felt welcomed. There were games and trivia, and we were presented with gift bags. The speakers were inspiring and the lunch was delicious. After lunch we were escorted to another part of the church where we shopped until it was time to go. 

**In Akoiya Harris'** *Madea's Garden*, an older Black woman [Deacon Angelee Harris] reclines in a lush patch of collard greens, a young girl seated nearby—



The scene suggests more than gardening; it evokes the quiet rituals of cultural transmission: lessons in horticulture, family history, spiritual grounding, and care. Set against a backdrop of sheet music from the 1855 gospel hymn *O How I Love Jesus* by Frederick Whitfield, Harris' collage is a visual bridge between generations. The elder figure is not just a gardener, but a steward of memory—rooted in the past yet nurturing the present. Through the act of tending a garden and tending a child, Harris depicts how Black matriarchs have historically preserved knowledge not through institutions, but through daily acts of nourishment and care.
