

Valley and Barbara Washington. The mimeographed, hand-stapled Zionews was distributed every Sunday after church services.

PRECEPTS FOR LIVING

June 1, 2025 ~ God's Commitment to An Unfaithful Bride Hosea 1:1-11

Unfaithfulness in covenant relationships leads to brokenness and alienation. How can brokenness and alienation be remedied? We have to commit to seek God's wisdom in brokenness. God uses Hosea and Gomer's marriage and the naming of their children as symbolic of Israel's alienation from God and His restorative plan.

June 8, 2025 ~ God's Love Brings Reconciliation Joel 2:12-13, 1849, 28-32

The rewards garnered from wholesome relationships may be shattered by unloving and unfaithful actions. How can these relationships be restored to their former glory? Joel recounts the benefits that emanate from a restored relationship with God. This theme *is* revisited in the New Testament as we are reminded of a loving and forgiving God who seeks to reconcile us to Christ

June 15, 2025 ~ God's Generosity Overcomes Selfishness Amos 6:4-8,11-14

Some people care only about accumulating lavish possessions for themselves and care nothing for those who possess little. What happens to greedy and selfish people? God will dispossess the greedy and selfish and thus demonstrate His justice. Generosity will protect us.

June 22, 2025 ~ *God's Mercy to Do the Right Thing* Jonah 3:1-10

Change is often required in life if we want to live in peace with others. What can we do about life situations that threatenus? We can seek God's mercy. After hearing God's wanting from Jonah, the people of Nineveh repented and sought God's mercy, and God forgave their *sins*.

June 29, 2025 ~ *Godly Leadership* Micah 3:1-3, 9-12, 6:6-8

Leaders often struggle with expectations of being examples of justice. How can leaders become models of justice worthy of emulation? Micah confronts the leadership of Israel for their failure to pursue justice and suggests that doing justice should be the basis of their lives.

JUNE OBSERVANCES

PENTECOST

Pentecost is celebrated 7 weeks/49 days after Easter Sunday. This year's date is June 8th.



Pentecost recalls the visitation of the Holy Spirit to 120 Christians, both apostles and followers. They spoke in tongues (in foreign languages that they had not previously personally known) to the assembled crowd. Three thousand were baptized!

The day was originally a Jewish festival which was called "Pentecost," because it was observed 50 days after Passover. The Greek word for 50th day is "pentecoste." This is usually regarded as the date of the birth of the Christian Church.

1. When the day of Pentecost came, they were all together in one place. 2 Suddenly a sound like the blowing of a violent wind came from heaven

and filled the whole house where they were sitting. 3 They saw what seemed to be tongues of fire that separated and came to rest on each of them. 4 All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other tongues as the Spirit enabled them...41 Those who accepted his message were baptized, and about three thousand were added to their number that day...46 Every day they continued to meet together in the temple courts. They broke bread in their homes and ate together with glad and sincere hearts, 47 praising God and enjoying the favor of all the people. And the Lord added to their number daily those who were being saved. [Read Acts 2]

TRINITY SUNDAY

Trinity Sunday is June 15th. It is observed on the eighth Sunday after Easter and the first Sunday after Pentecost on the Western liturgical calendar. It honors the Holy Trinity —The Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. Symbols sometimes used include fire, wind and a dove. The trinity is taught in

JUNETEENTH

Made an official national holiday in 2022, Juneteenth began in Galveston, TX, which was the western-most area of the Union in 1865. When enslaved people there were told of their emancipation on **June 19, 1865**, they had technically already been freed two and a half years prior, when President Abraham Lincoln issued the Emancipation Proclamation on January 1, 1863.

Slaveholders in Texas had kept the information to themselves, extending the period of violent exploitation of enslaved African Americans. The following year, in 1866, a celebration was held in Texas, the first Juneteenth observance to recognize freedom from slavery in the U.S.

JUNETEENTH did not become a paid holiday for Washington State employees until 2022!




